UDL Principles	Sample Online Course Elements
Multiple means of engagement	<ul> <li>Consistent course organization</li> <li>Clearly identified and stated learning objectives for each module</li> <li>Choice to complete activities individually or in small groups</li> <li>Weekly "Are you on track?" self-monitoring checklists</li> <li>Using real classrooms for final project</li> <li>Exemplars of projects</li> <li>Ongoing written and video feedback to students</li> <li>Timely responses to students emails</li> <li>Intermitted reflective blog entries</li> <li>FAQ blog</li> <li>Virtual office hours</li> </ul>
Multiple means of representation	<ul> <li>Content in text, audio, video formats (each lecture in four formats: video presentation, regular PowerPoint for note taking, MP3, &amp; text transcript)</li> <li>Readings in digital format</li> <li>Links to free text-to-speech programs</li> <li>Captioned videos</li> <li>Simulations and interactive websites</li> <li>Optional and recorded synchronous sessions</li> <li>Weekly video messages highlighting previous and upcoming content</li> </ul>
Multiple means of action/ expression	<ul> <li>Flexibility in how weekly activities and major assignments to be completed (allowing for various formats: written, multimedia presentations, video, creating graphic organizer, etc.)</li> <li>Choice to participate in discussions using text, video, etc.</li> <li>Flexible deadlines on some assignments</li> <li>Gradual release of learning modules</li> <li>Project outlines, rubrics, and exemplars</li> <li>Multiple opportunities to receive feedback on the major projects throughout the semester</li> <li>Continuous instructor and peer feedback</li> </ul>



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
