### Teaching Excellence Awards

**Nomination Deadline for full-time TEA: Monday, October 12, 2020**

**Nomination Deadline for Online and Adjunct TEA: Tuesday, December 1st, 2020**

The 2021 George Mason University Teaching Excellence Awards are open to faculty with significant teaching experience at George Mason.

- **Our TEAs for full-time faculty** (term and tenure-line) offer recognition for excellent teaching overall, and special recognitions for excellence in teaching General Education (Mason Core) or High Impact Learning. Faculty who have already completed three or more years teaching at Mason are eligible.
- **The Adjunct Teaching Excellence Awards** recognize excellence in the teaching of part-time faculty who have already completed teaching courses in at least six semesters at Mason.
- **The Online Teaching Excellence Awards** recognize teaching excellence in faculty members who have taught at least one fully-online course at Mason. Faculty may be full-time or part-time, and need to have taught online at least four complete semesters at Mason.

Students, faculty members, or administrators may nominate any faculty member for an award (we don't accept self-nominations). See more information [on our website](#).

### New Guidelines for Evaluation of Teaching

In collaboration with Faculty Affairs, we have created a new page called [Supporting Efforts to Document and Assess Teaching and Learning](#). As evaluation policies at Mason evolve to include a multi-factor or portfolio-based approach to evaluating teaching, we hope that these resources can help faculty identify ways to document the work and achievements of their teaching, and help departments and evaluators review the work of their colleagues.

## Online Teaching Opportunities

### Stearns Center Continues Courses to Help Faculty Prep for Spring Courses

The Stearns Center for Teaching and Learning will continue to offer sections of the **Online Course Development Primer (OCDP)** and **Pivotal Pedagogy Fundamentals (PPF) course** for faculty preparing to teach courses in the spring term. Since Spring 2020, the center has worked with over 600 faculty to support the conceptualization, design, and development of hybrid and online courses. We welcome all Mason faculty to use our registration form to [sign up for our fall program dates](#) by Friday, September 11; faculty will be matched wherever possible with others from related fields, and will work with Stearns Center staff and faculty co-leaders in each course. These seven-week programs will begin on Wednesday, September 30 and conclude on Tuesday, November 19. On average, the OCDP requires about 5-10 hours of work per week, and the PPF about 4-5 hours.
